

Woking Lawn Tennis & Croquet Club

Byelaws

1. Grass and hard tennis courts are available for play on first come first serve basis, subject to any notices from the groundsman and the provisions of Byelaw 2 and 10.
2. The Tennis Committee may run a court reservation system as and when appropriate. It may also establish priority use of the grass and hard courts for the Club and individual competitions, for members and juniors and for coaching. Such priorities will be displayed on the Tennis Notice Board.
3. For periods in which no priority use applies as determined by the Tennis Committee (see 2) and subject to the provisions of Byelaw 10; juniors have the same right of access to courts as members. During periods when there is no reservation system in place and all courts being used for social tennis are occupied, members and juniors using a court shall make that court available to waiting players at the conclusion of the set (tie break applies).
4. Members, juniors and their guests must be suitably dressed in recognised tennis attire when using tennis courts. Only tennis specific shoes are permitted. Guest fees must be paid on arrival at the Club.
5. Dogs must be kept on a lead and with their owners at all times when on the Club premises. Dogs must be kept to the Club's pathways and are not permitted to enter any part of the Club's playing areas
6. For the purpose of giving parties, members may reserve courts subject to availability and for a fee to be determined by the Tennis Committee. Members wishing to reserve courts must give three days' clear notice to the Club Secretary.
7. The booking of the Croquet Lawns will be arranged by the Croquet Committee. When requested by the Croquet Committee, the Tennis Committee will make grass courts available for croquet tournaments subject to the dates being agreed between the Chairman of the Tennis, Croquet and Greens Committees, prior to the Fixture List being drawn up.
8. Meals for matches, special events, parties and all other occasions will be supplied from the Club's kitchen unless the Bar Officer and Social Committee decides otherwise, to whom requests should be submitted at least a week before. Alcohol should not be brought onto the premises except with the agreement of the bar officer.
9. Juniors under the age of 11 must be accompanied and supervised at all times by a person over the age of 18 whilst on the Club Premises (except whilst under the direct control of a Club coach on court). Neither the Club nor its officers nor employees can accept any liability or responsibility whatsoever or howsoever arising for any Junior under the age of 11 (except as stated) whilst on Club premises.
10. During Floodlight usage:-
 - (a) No junior shall have a "hitting" session with a club-approved "hitting" coach after 7pm on weekdays
 - (b) adults will take priority over juniors between 7.30 pm to 9.30 pm on Monday to Thursday.
 - (c) On a Monday and Wednesday doubles will be prioritised over singles play from 7.30pm to 9.30pm. The order of priority at these times will therefore be:
 - (i) adult doubles
 - (ii) adult singles
 - (iii) junior doubles
 - (iv) junior singles
11. No member shall park a motor vehicle in Pine Road other than on the Club side of Pine Road between the corner of the junction of Hook Heath Road and the boundary of the premises of the Club as it adjoins Columbine House.
12. The Croquet Lawns may only be used by non-Croquet section members if:
 - (a) the non-croquet member is supervised by a croquet member, or has been approved by the croquet committee for unsupervised play, and
 - (b) to ensure compliance with 12(a) the key to the Croquet shed shall only be made available to a Croquet member.
